Lindsey, a certified public accountant, brings more than 20 years of experience in accounting for corporate and government sectors. Her previous experience includes serving as Chief Financial Officer for Shelby County Schools, where she oversaw a \$1.3 billion budget, and working in the Shelby County Finance office as a grants accounting and revenue manager, and budget controller. Before that, Lindsey spent eight years with the Trustee's Office in various management positions.



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As Director of Accounting, Lindsey is responsible for oversight of accounting, banking, budgetary, treasury and finance activities and functions. She rejoined the Trustee's Office last year as a project manager, managing a large data conversion. Lindsey holds a B.B.A in Business Administration from the University of Memphis.

Dunseath joined the Trustee's Office in 2011 and has served as Human Resource Manager for the past four years. His previous experience includes senior level management positions with several companies, including serving as Senior VP of Administration and Chief Financial Officer for Varsity Brands, Inc.

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As CFO at Varsity, he was one of five senior officers responsible for transforming a small private cheerleading company into a publicly traded company. Dunseath earned a degree in Marketing from the University of Arkansas.

As Director of Collections he will oversee the collection of current and delinquent property taxes for Shelby County and its municipalities. The office collects approximately 70 percent of the County's annual budget.
