*\*These dates reflect the most recent ordinance dates. Several districts existed prior to 1988 but each had to be re-adopted after a brief period when City Council nullified and then later reinstated Landmarks itself. Early districts include Cotton Row, Gayoso-Peabody, Victorian Village, Annesdale Park and Annesdale-Snowden plus a number of individual properties that are no longer included.*

*\*\*The number is the number of parcels (i.e. lots) within a district per the Shelby County Tax Assessor's records. Note that this is close to but rarely the exact number of what we'd consider a "property". For example Collins Chapel is one site with one owner yet it says 5 parcels because that is the number of legal lots contained with their church campus.*

*\*\*\*Strathmore Circle, which is within the boundaries of Lea's Woods, was listed on the National Register (NR) as its own NR historic district on 12/17/98.*

*\*\*\*While the district itself is not NR listed, there are two properties within its boundaries that are individually listed on the NR:*

*Eli Rayner House (1856), 1020 Rayner, listed 5/9/77*

*Rozelle Elementary School (1914), 993 Roland St., listed 9/17/82*
